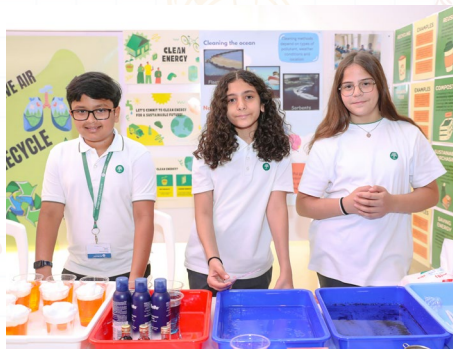
Art & Science Exhibition

On May 24, the school auditorium was transformed into a vibrant hub of discovery and innovation for our annual Arts and Sciences Exhibition. Students from grades 2 through 12 participated, and parents were warmly welcomed to experience the creativity and curiosity of our young learners firsthand.

The exhibition was divided into two main sections: club showcases and a competition arena. School clubs presented projects they had worked on throughout the year, while students from grades 5 to 8 entered a judged competition, with winners announced at the event.

Projects covered a broad range of topics. Grade 2 students explored sound and light, Grade 4 students presented their "Young Engineers" initiative, and Grade 5 to 7 students focused on sustainability themes. Older students, from Grade 7 to Grade 12, impressed visitors with their chemistry and physics projects, demonstrating not just academic knowledge but also strong practical application and problem-solving skills.

A standout feature of the exhibition was the STEAM Zone, which highlighted student work in robotics, Arduino, Micro:bit programming, 3D printing, and electronics. Overall, Health Day at ISC-Manama was a successful and educational event that motivated students to embrace healthier habits and understand the importance of taking care of their physical and mental well-being.



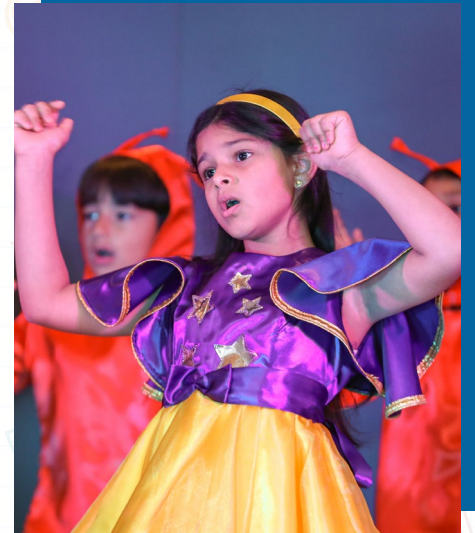
KG1- Grade 4 concerts
